

## FOLLOWING THE 'TRAIL': WHICH DATABASES COVER A SPECIFIC JOURNAL OR SUBJECT?

**Catalog**

Click on **Catalog**, then click the link for a [Journal/Magazine/Newspaper Title](#) search.

If you know the **title** of a specific journal (e.g. from a list of references in an article you have found), you can search for that journal title by typing in the name of the journal or browse by clicking on the alphabetical links (for the first letter of a journal title). **This will show you the databases that CCP has which contain articles from that journal.**

If you want to know which databases cover a specific **subject** area, use the pull-down box under '**Browse e-journals by subject**'; hint: for literature and literary topics, look under Humanities and Reference
